**I. Accomplishments / Highlights**

- A. Officer Coffman responded to the report of a residential burglary. Off. Coffman spoke with a witness, who saw two juveniles moving items from the residence, including a motorcycle. During the investigation, Officer Coffman was able to identify two juvenile suspects. Officer Coffman also recovered all the items that were taken from the residence, including the motorcycle.
- B. Officers responded to the downtown area for multiple 911 calls involving a man described as erratic and crazy. The man was reported as running into business, screaming and yelling, breaking windows, and physically assaulting people. Officers located the man at Jumpstart and took him into custody. The subject was having a psychotic episode, likely caused by heavy drug use. He had to be sedated by EMS and transported to St. Joseph Hospital. Four misdemeanor cases resulted.
- C. Officers were dispatched to 1500 block of Washington Lane for a physical disturbance. Officers contacted the victim who told officers her boyfriend had choked her and was intoxicated. There were several witnesses who corroborated what the victim had said. The boyfriend was then arrested, processed, and released on bond. On April 30, 2023, shortly after the suspect had bonded out, he violated the no contact order by telling his girlfriend he was going to kill her and was on his way over to the house. Officers intercepted the suspect leaving his mother's house, heading in the direction of their house. Suspect was arrested, processed, and transported to the Butler County Jail for criminal threats and violation of a protective order.
- D. Officer Coffman conducted a routine traffic stop. Upon making contact with the driver and passenger, Officer Coffman could smell the odor of burnt marijuana. During an interview with the driver, Officer Coffman found that there was a small amount of marijuana inside of the center console. During the search of the driver, Officer Coffman found a small rock of methamphetamine. Off. Coffman conducted a search of the vehicle, where several burnt blunts, along with a glass Pyrex pipe and other paraphernalia was found. Both the driver and passenger were arrested for possession of methamphetamine, possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia.
- E. Lieutenant Johnston, Detective Sergeant Scheuber and Officer Brown assisted the United States Department of Homeland Security and the Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office in serving a search warrant at a local home as part of an ongoing child porn investigation. The suspect in that case has since been arrested and faces numerous child porn and sex offense charges.

- F. Detective Sergeant Scheuber assisted patrol with covering a shift while Officer Weber was off. During that coverage a responded to the report of a student at the middle school in possession of a gun and knife. The gun was found to be an airsoft type gun and the knife was real. No criminal charges were filed, and the situation was dealt with by the school.
- G. Officer Sisco worked a DUI which turned into a felony because the female suspect had two juvenile females with her while she was operating the vehicle under the influence.
- H. Officer Cosby conducted extra patrol and observed a U-Haul in the downtown area at 0300 hours. Because of the time the people in the U-Haul were watched as they got out. Contact was made and male that has extensive burglary history and female were identified. The female had a warrant from another jurisdiction, and she was arrested.
- I. Officers were dispatched to 1300 block of State Street for the report of a disturbance. Upon arrival officers contacted the staff at the Augusta Family Practice who said the infant was extremely ill due to losing a pound in a week's time. Staff said the infant's vitals were life threatening. Employees said an infant's mother was causing a scene because they would not release the infant to the parent, for fear the parent was not going to take the child to the hospital. The doctor determined from the vitals of the infant; the infant needed care immediately. EMS was called to the scene where the infant was transported to the hospital. Wichita PD was notified by CID that they may have an abuse case that occurred in their city and the victim was on the way to the hospital in Wichita.
- J. Officer Smith and Officer Orocio was dispatched for an injury accident involving a UTV. During the investigation, Officer Smith found that the driver of the UTV had possibly been drinking prior to the accident. Officer Smith conducted SFST's, where it was determined that the driver of the UTV was under the influence. The driver of the UTV was arrested for DUI, Reckless Driving, Transporting an open container, along with no registration for the UTV. Two occupants in the UTV were transported to the hospital with serious injuries.
