I. Accomplishments / Highlights

- A. Lieutenant Johnston, Detective Sergeant Scheuber and Officer Troy Brown assisted the United States Department of Homeland Security and the Sedgwick County Sheriff's Officer in serving a search warrant at a local home as part of an ongoing child porn investigation. The suspect in that case has since been arrested and faces numerous child porn and sex offence charges.
- B. SRO Sergeant Meckel coordinated and oversaw the presentation of the 48th Annual ADPS Bugs Bunny Club at the Augusta Historical Theater over 3 weekends in March. The BBC was a huge success again this year!
- C. Sergeant Strobbe responded to a call where the suspects were making statements about shooting up the victim's house. The suspects were arrested after refusing to identify themselves. Two of the suspects referred to them being in a gang. The case was sent to the county attorney.
- D. Officer Coffman responded to the report of an unconscious female inside a vehicle. Officer Coffman made contact with the female, where Officer Coffman found a piece of foil that had a blue pill on it. During further investigation, Officer Coffman found thirteen "dirty 30" pills, 3.4 grams of marijuana, along with drug paraphernalia. The female was arrested on several drug charges to include distribution of fentanyl.
- E. Officers responded to a vehicle versus pedestrian traffic accident. A subject was crossing Walnut in the crosswalk during a rain shower and the driver did not see him. The victim was transported to Wesley with a broken leg, shattered pelvis, and a head injury.
- F. Officer Orocio took the report of a stolen vehicle. Officers checked the Flock system, finding that the stolen vehicle was in Wichita. Officers also found that the vehicle was later in the Derby Area. The stolen vehicle was recovered on March 30th, the stolen vehicle was recovered after being in a chase with Andover PD.
- G. Officers were investigating a suspicious person at the armory and after the suspect was identified it was found he a warrant for his arrest. The suspect led Officers on a short foot chase. With assistance from Sergeant Schueber the suspect was taken into custody all involved played a part in taking him into custody.
- H. Officers responded to Jumpstart when the manager was notified that the store was empty, and the cash registers were open. Investigation showed that an unknown caller, pretending to be

the store owner, convinced the cashier to take the store's cash and drive to Wichita. The cashier was beginning to deposit the money into a Bitcoin machine when the manager was able to stop her and convince her it was a scam.

- I. Officer. Brown took a report of a burglary at 418 State. During the investigation, it was revealed that two kerosene heaters and six battery powered Craftsman drills were taken. Later in the day, Lt. Johnston received four CrimeStopper tips, that stated that kerosene heaters were located in the 500 block of Osage. Officers went to the 500 block of Osage, where the kerosene heaters were sitting in the driveway. Officers also found two of the drills, along with three empty tool bags. Officer. Brown received a security video from Sugar Shane's that showed an individual kicking the rear door. The video also showed other individuals entering the building and removing the aforementioned items.
- J. Officer Sisco responded to the report of a person having an open container. Watching the vehicle leave Sonic and go to Presto gas station he followed it into Presto. After speaking to the driver, Officer Sisco determined he was transporting an open container and had an odor of an alcoholic beverage about his breath. It was then determined after SFST's the driver was found to be impaired. The driver was arrested for transporting an open container and driving under the influence.
